

1992 – Oct 20 – Eyewitness debuts at the Rock-It Club with Warrant, who was in Morrisound recording their Dog Eat Dog album

1993 – Oct 16 – Livestock IV – Under the pall of sadness for Criss Oliva's tragic death, the concert forged ahead with Eyewitness, Hear Comes Rusty, Jackyl, Cry of Love, Candlebox, Steppenwolf, and Sunday the 17th, Nudeswirl, Tribe after Tribe, Screamin' Cheetah Wheelies, Eric Gales, Saigon Kick, and Anthrax.

1994 – Aug 12 – Ticketmaster Music Showcase at Club Detroit (please add Eyewitness).

1995 – Eyewitness releases s/t debut album on UK label Now and Then and plays the Gods Festival at the Astoria in London, appearing on MTV Europe's Headbanger's Ball.

1995 – Feb 26 – Eyewitness performs at the Florida Guitar Show at Thoroughbred with Vinnie Moore, Albert Lee and Al Di Meola.

1996 – Eyewitness releases "Messiah Complex" album that is panned by melodic rock critics in Japan and Europe for being too dark and heavy.

1997 – Eyewitness changes their name to Millenium and returns to its melodic rock style, releasing its s/t debut on Now and Then, and returns to the UK to play The Gods Festival that features Kip Winger and UK band Ten, who takes Millenium on its Euro tour.

1998 – Millenium releases its critically acclaimed album "Angelfire" on Frontiers Records.

1998 – Producer Paul Curcio (RIP) forms a band in Clearwater featuring former Doobie Brothers David Shogren (RIP), Cornelius Bumpus (RIP), and Chet McCracken. To round out the group, Curcio recruits Tampa Bay area musicians Earl and Arch from the Bleeding Hearts, keyboardist Billy Martin and singer Todd Plant of Eyewitness/Millenium. After Shogren's death, the band adds Genitorturers bassist Sean Colpoys and later jazz bassist Allen Carman, sax/flute player David Muse of Firefall & Marshall Tucker fame to replace Bumpus and later, former Chicago & Peter Cetera guitarist Chris Pinnick. The group played festivals across the USA with groups like Blue Oyster Cult, Jefferson Starship, Humble Pie, Black Oak Arkansas, Mitch Ryder & the Detroit Wheels, Iron Butterfly, Rare Earth, The Toler Brothers, Mickey Thomas' Starship, Little River Band, Steppenwolf, War and many others.

2003 – Sarasota based progressive rock band Cryptic Vision releases its debut "Moments of Clarity" on ProgRock Records.

2005 – Mar 4 – please add that Cryptic Vision's debut show at Jannus Landing was opening for Kansas.

2005 – Cryptic Vision releases "Live at ROSfest 2005" on ProgRock Records.

2006 – Cryptic Vision releases "In a World" on Progrock Records and does shows with prog metal band Kamelot, Swedish Progers The Flower Kings, and on the B Stage at St. Pete's Ribfest before Toto.

2007 – May 13 – Cryptic Vision opens for the original lineup of Asia as they kick off their US tour at Van Wezel Hall in Sarasota.

2011 – Cryptic Vision releases "Of Infinite Possibilities"
